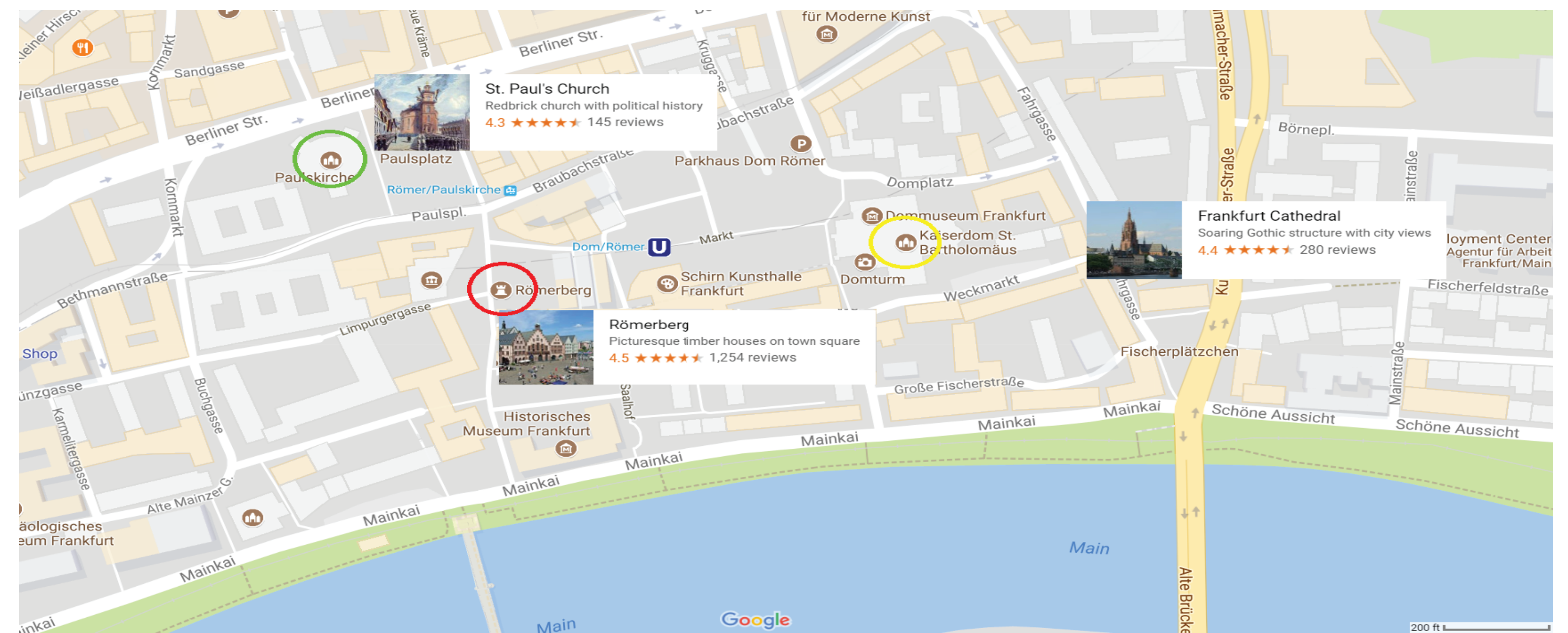

FRANKFURTER TRÜMMEREXPRESS (ALSO KNOWN AS THE DEBRIS RECOVERY SOCIETY) BUILD AND TRANSPORTED TILES, BRICKS, AND SLABS.



400 MILLION CUBIC METERS OF RUBBLE WAS PILED UP AFTER THE WAR. (THIS ENOUGH TO BUILD A WALL 2 METERS THICK AND 7 METERS HIGH)
