The Project Charter is the second step in approving a project (following approval of the Business Case/Proposal). This document, once signed off, gives formal authority to move forward with the project as documented below.

Formal approval should be communicated via email to allow for authority and timestamping. Approval email should include the charter as an attachment and document the Version number of the approved charter.

#### Project Description

This project proposes to add a student research spotlight element to the existing Faculty Research Spotlight. The student version will be informal and frequent and highlight the interesting research students are doing in and out of class. Students will get to see their interests as research and to realize that they are already a part of the scholarly conversation.
