

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



How to facilitate student success with OER?




UH Alternative Textbook Incentive Program


Encourage instructors to adopt OER instead of commercial textbooks

- Incentives range from \$500-2,500
- Helps address barriers
- Added motivation to adopt


UH Alternative Textbook Incentive Program


Shifting focus

Faculty


- Subject expertise

Takeaways so far

- Pathways to facilitating student success
 - Awareness, education, engagement
- On't try to do all the things all the time (burnout)
- Facilitating student success can happen at the program-level and the individual-level



Stakeholders and collaborators



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If you want to go fast, go alone.

If you want to go far, go together.

When should I collaborate?

1. What is the purpose?

2. Who are ideal collaborators? Why?

3. What are the expectations?

Example: Faculty co-presenters

Purpose: Educate faculty about OER, encourage adoptions

Collaborators: Faculty who have used OER

Expectations: Give a 12–15 minute presentation on your experience; share what would be helpful for others




Example: Consultation with subject librarian

Purpose: Support faculty member who is interested in using OER

Collaborators: Subject librarian with knowledge of disciplinary library resources

Expectations: Join the consultation and provide info if needed



Example: Team review of applications

Purpose: Review and score incentive program applications

Collaborators: Faculty, instructional designer, and librarians

Expectations: Attend three meetings, test scoring rubric, score applications, and contribute to award decisions


Campus OER Committee


How do we do this? Nuts and bolts
