



PRESERVATION

"green wedge" system allows for more overall square mileage of green space with

intimidated by the concept, Stockholm has already approved it.


TRANSPORTATION INFRASTRUCTURE

Stockholm's aims to be a "walking city" by 2030. This means increased transportation infrastructure and reshaping public spaces to prioritize foot and bicycle traffic instead of cars. One example of this is Stureplan Plaza, which Stockholm remodeled in the 1990s from a congested traffic junction. Their T-Bana system is also being reworked to create more open, safe spaces for public transit customers.
