# Association Between Acculturative Stress and Drinking Among Hispanic/Latino Immigrant Undergraduates Moderated by Drinking to Cope and Social Norms

# Introduction

- Hispanic/Latino students may not consider themselves "typical" students (McCabe et al., 2019).
- Normalized alcohol use among Hispanic/Latino students could be related to coping motives and acculturation (Conn et al., 2017).
- Past literature demonstrates that acculturative stress is associated with drinking and overestimating peer drinking is associated with drinking (LaBrie et al., 2011; Lui & Zamboanga 2018).

# Hypotheses

- 1. Acculturative stress will be positively associated with drinking outcomes
- 2. Associations between acculturative stress and drinking will be stronger for those who endorsed drinking to cope and for those who reported higher perceived drinking norms.

# Methods

# **Participants**

- 112 Hispanic/Latino undergraduates (87.5% females,  $M_{age}$  = 20.80, SD  $_{age}$  = 1.80)
- 66.96% from Mexico, 13.39% from El Salvador, 4.46% from Venezuela

## Measures

- Descriptive Social Norms: Drinking Norms Rating Form (DNRF;
   Turrisi, Mastroleo, Mallett, Larimer, & Kilmer, 2007)
- Alcohol-related Consequences: The Young Adult Alcohol Consequences Questionnaire
- Acculturative Stress: The Social, Attitudinal, Familial, and Environmental Acculturative Stress Scale (SAFE; Padilla et al., 1985; Mena et al., 1987)
- Drinking to Cope: Drinking Motives Questionnaire (Cooper, 1994)
   Data Analytic Strategy
- Outcomes were count variables bounded by zero, so a negative binomial regression model was used. All predictors were meancentered.

# Results

### **Acculturative Stress**

Not associated with either drinking outcome

# **Drinking to Cope**

Positively associated with both weekly drinks (b=0.969, p=.010) and alcohol-related consequences (b=1.590, p=.002)


#### **Social Norms**

Negativity associated with alcohol-related consequences (b=-0.121, p=.021)

#### Interaction

Significant interaction between acculturative stress and drinking norms (b=.001, p=.049)

# Discussion/Limitations

- Acculturative stress was not associated with either drinking norms
- The immigrant paradox or unmeasured protective factors could have influenced these findings (Alamilla et al., 2020; Bekteshi & Kang 2020).
- We did not measure other aspects of alcohol nor examine Latino/Hispanic subgroups separately
- Future research should explore different drinking motives and its association with acculturative stress among immigrant students (Conn et al., 2017).
