



Yahoo! Groups - groups.yahoo.com


- Pros: share files, images, easy to post, calendaring, flat file searchable database
- Cons: better tools exist for managing links, file sharing, and calendaring, must have Yahoo! ID link to email address






Google Groups - groups.google.com

- Pros: easier interface than yahoo groups, easier member profiles, more intuitive, clean interface, file and link sharing
- Cons: no group calendar integration, no searchable flat-file database



Cc: Betty - ccbetty.com

- Pros: You can cc: betty@ccbetty.com on all your email group discussions and it automatically grabs and sorts your images, videos, messages, events, and other types of files
- Cons: yet another place to look for stored files, and you have to remember to cc: betty




Google Wave - wave.google.com

- Pros: real-time communication and collaboration; discuss text, photos, videos, maps; play games; reply anywhere in a message, edit the content, add participants - all at any point in the process; playback/rewind the wave
- Cons: need an invite from someone currently using it

Project Management Tools




Remember the Milk - rememberthemilk.com

- Pros: send/receive tasks, prioritize & move tasks to projects/categories, browser integration, reminders
- Cons: no nested tasks or filesharing



ClockingIT- clockingit.com

- Pros: multilingual support, task/project assignment, reports, email/RSS/iCal updates, wiki, forum, chat, no fees
- Cons: interface is text-heavy & clunky in appearance




Zoho Projects - projects.zoho.com

- Pros: calendaring, task/project assignment, time reports, document sharing, wiki, chat
- Cons: free version is limited to one project and 100MB storage (i.e. SAK for opening letters)



The Big Picture - thebigpic.org


- Pros: intuitive tools, iCal calendar feed, projects can be shared or kept private, shared projects can be modified locally
- Cons: collaborators must already have accounts to be added, calendar not two-way with existing calendaring systems




- Pros: Combines Writer, Sheet, & Show; uses sidebar, familiar look, best online word processor available
- Cons: no as-you-type spell checking, tagging and creating folders to organize files is clunky


Google Docs - docs.google.com

- Pros: can embed files in other sites, upload existing files, download in multiple formats, control access, clean and yet sophisticated interface, includes documents, spreadsheets, presentations, forms
- Cons: better than most on mobile devices, not as many features as its competitors, but "it's good enough"




ThinkFree - thinkfree.com

- Pros: looks and feels like MOffice, advanced editing features, can use with Google docs w/out having to transfer files
- Cons: looks and feels like MOffice, interface can be confusing, creating new documents is slow



Adobe Buzzword- expressocorp.com

- Pros: only word processing; has ability to edit headers and footers, page numbering, endnotes, & more
- Cons: Flash heavy, so not good for older computers




Dabble DB - dabbledb.com

- Pros: easy to create databases, pivot tables, maps, graphs, charts, paid version offers more features
- Cons: viewing individual records is clunky, user management, free for up to 15 users, 100,000 entries, no encryption, no attachments, no logo or custom colors

Creativity Tools




skrbl - skrbl.com

- Pros: simple text and shape tools
- Cons: free for only one user (with unlimited guests), free version is more limited, too, in storage capacity & features




EtherPad - etherpad.com

- Pros: authorship indicators, real-time with playback, saved versions
- Cons: text-only, in paragraph or outline form, free version is public with no option to associate with one's account



Creately - creately.com

- Pros: many options for shapes, connectors, colors, etc.; pay version has more support, and the pricing is "pay what you want"
- Cons: free version limited in number of collaborators, size, and is branded




MindMeister - mindmeister.com

- Pros: many tools & features with flexibility in use; keyboard shortcuts; extensive help documentation; playback option; pay version is heavily discounted for academic use
- Cons: free version limited to 3 mindmaps; supported by advertising; not encrypted

Collaborative Website Building & Video Conferencing




WetPaint - wetpaint.com

- Pros: build a website fast, incorporates best features of wikis, blogs, forums and social networks
- Cons: advertisements galore, chaotic feel to designs, limited ability to change layout




Tinychat - tinychat.com

- Pros: disposable conference rooms, easy to set up, great for video conferencing, embeddable, even has developerAPI
- Cons: everyone needs a good connection, limited to 300 people in a room



Dimdim - dimdim.com

- Pros: open source, api for mashups, synchronized live presentations, whiteboards and websites, video and audio, easy to use
- Cons: free up to 20 people, get significantly more features with Pro version, no session recordings, little buggy




Vyew - vyew.com

- Pros: share video, audio, presentations, and other file types, participants can interact, desktop sharing, free up to 10 participants
- Cons: a little slow to respond, video doesn't always come in

- Pros: real-time schedule updating, makes meeting time suggestions
- Cons: only works with Google Calendar






Doodle - doodle.com

- Pros: anyone can participate no account required, uses polling type set up to give options, integration w/ calendaring systems is optional, mobile options
- Cons: no option for participants to suggest alternative times



- Pros: uses natural language to create appointments, todo items, & reminders; RSS, iCal, etc.
- Cons: no easy way to find contacts who are already using the service, so sharing may be limited



Tungle - tungle.com

- Pros: syncs with most calendaring systems, organizers propose times, participants select preferences, meetings are scheduled & synced with local accounts
- Cons: collaborators must have accounts configured
